Tools for Daily Life and Manufacturing

For the people living in Yamba, manufacturing was an indispensable part of their lives. Archaeological excavations have found numerous tools, such as a pencil case, inkstone, and brush, which were used for recording on letters; a flint box used to make fires; a kitchen knife and grater for cooking; a Masu, a scale that measure quantity and weight; a whetstone for maintaining blades, and so on. These are tools for daily life that are also used for recording, processing, and managing manufacturing.
